



SEX EDUCATION POLICY

1. Sex education will be provided in such a way as to encourage pupils to have regard to moral considerations and the value of family life
2. Sex education forms part of the core science curriculum within the School. Issues relating to sex education may also be discussed in ethics and health education lessons or may be debated as part of the English curriculum.
3. There are PSHCE (personal, social, health and citizenship education) lectures and seminars provided by specialist outside speakers for specific year groups: these cover topics such as contraception, AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases. Parents are informed in advance about these special sessions and have the right to withdraw their daughter from them.
